Think I'd better write you before you get started on your trip. I think it is grand that you can go, and take Graham with you. Here is Albert's address:

1230 East 69th St.

I take the Illinois Central from either the Randolph or Wabash station out to 67th and then walk along the edge of the cemetery, between the railroad embankment and the cemetery wall, to 69th. It is a short cut. The trains do not stop at 69th as they used to. If in doubt when you get off at 67th you could ask anyone in the station how to cut through to 69th and they would show you where the walk is - just across the street after you go downstairs to 67th. Albert's is one of the little brick bungalows about three doors west of where the path comes out on 69th street. West is to your right as you come off the path.

Am sure you will have an enjoyable trip. Wish I were going with you.

I am not going to write any more - am anxious to get this off as you may be leaving any time now.
