

The Roots of the Kaisers

Interesting Tidbit: Lee Kaiser has a medal awarded to Henry F. Kaiser when he enlisted for the US civil war. It was for being in the first units to enlist, and the 1st defenders to get to Washington DC. Photos & details of his Civil War service on wilk4.com

Interesting Tidbit: Henry F. Kaiser served in the US civil war and became blind during & after his service. He went through a lengthy process to qualify for disability benefits, asserting that the blindness was a result of his service. As a result, there is now a large file of info about HFK and his family in the National Archives.

Henry F. Kaiser was born 1835 in Allegheny City, PA, (maybe) 3 days after his parents arrived in the US (probably from Germany)

Interesting Tidbit: Henry played an accordion on the street at times after he became blind and Harry would go along to guide him and to hold the cup. We still have the accordion and a song he wrote & used to sing.

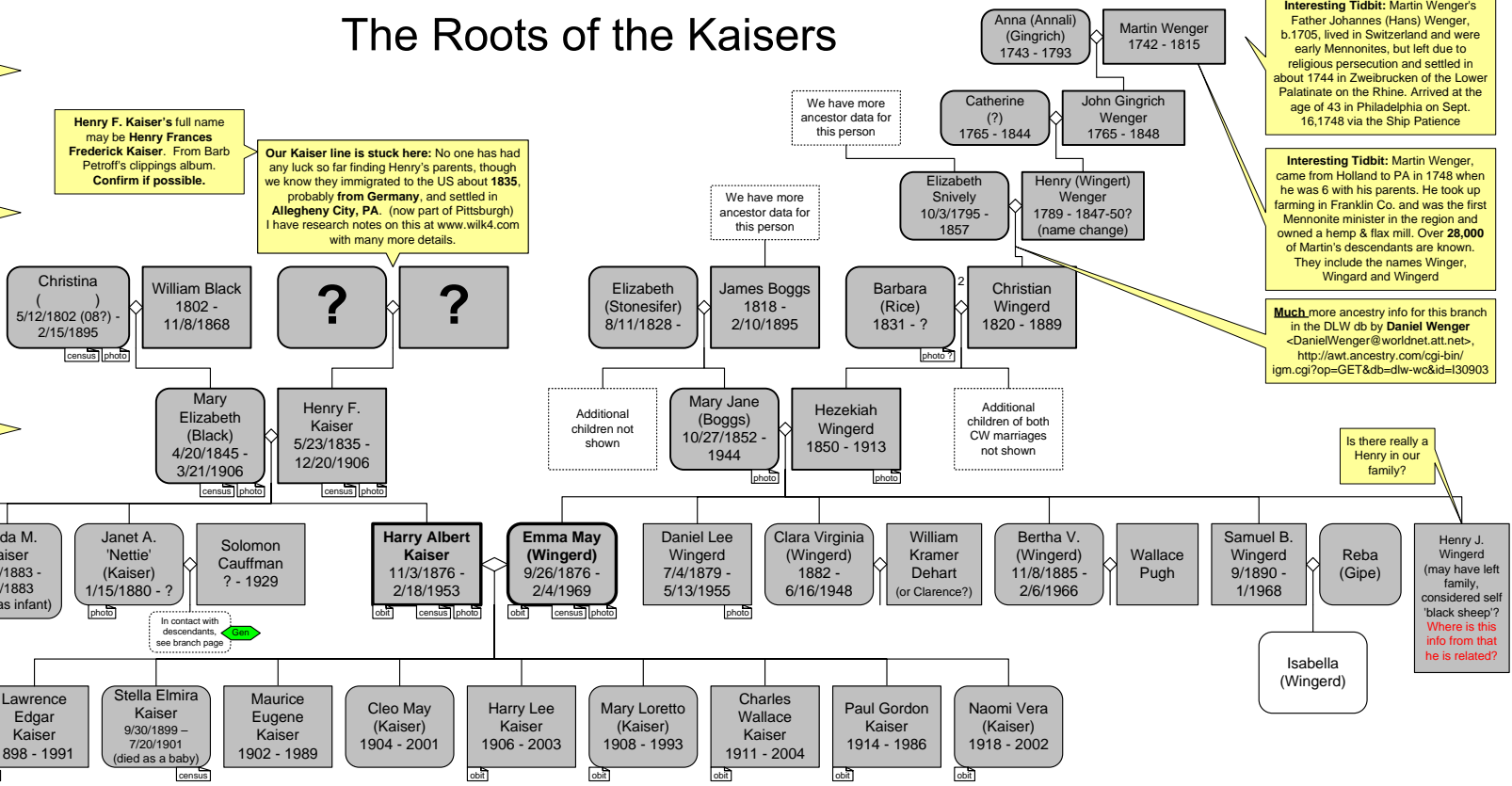
Henry F. Kaiser's full name may be **Henry Frances Frederick Kaiser**. From Barb Petroff's clippings album. **Confirm if possible.**

Our Kaiser line is stuck here: No one has had any luck so far finding Henry's parents, though we know they immigrated to the US about 1835, probably from **Germany**, and settled in **Allegheny City, PA**. (now part of Pittsburgh) I have research notes on this at www.wilk4.com with many more details.

Interesting Tidbit: Martin Wenger's Father Johannes (Hans) Wenger, b.1705, lived in Switzerland and were early Mennonites, but left due to religious persecution and settled in about 1744 in Zweibrucken of the Lower Palatinate on the Rhine. Arrived at the age of 43 in Philadelphia on Sept. 16, 1748 via the Ship Patience

Interesting Tidbit: Martin Wenger, came from Holland to PA in 1748 when he was 6 with his parents. He took up farming in Franklin Co. and was the first Mennonite minister in the region and owned a hemp & flax mill. Over **28,000** of Martin's descendants are known. They include the names Winger, Wingard and Wingerd
